



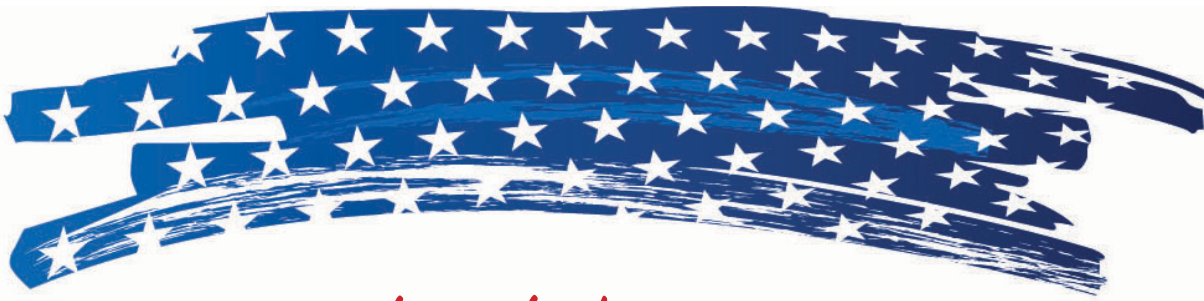

Coachella Valley

The 250-year story of the Coachella Valley is a remarkable narrative of adaptation, innovation, and transformation - one that mirrors the broader history of the American West.

Roughly two and a half centuries ago, long before the United States existed as a nation, the valley was home to the Cahuilla people. Living in small, resourceful communities, they adapted to the desert's extremes through an intimate understanding of the land. They relied on seasonal water sources, native plants, and trade routes that connected them to neighboring tribes. Their presence established the valley's earliest identity - one rooted in resilience and respect for nature.

By the late 18th and early 19th centuries, Spanish explorers began passing through the region, followed by Mexican control after independence from Spain. Though the valley itself remained sparsely populated due to its

harsh climate, it became part of a broader network of trails and territorial expansion in what would eventually become California.

The mid-1800s brought a major shift following the Mexican-American War, when California and the Coachella Valley became part of the United States. For decades afterward, the valley remained largely undeveloped, known more for its unforgiving desert conditions than for opportunity.

That perception changed dramatically in the early 20th century with the arrival of large-scale irrigation. Engineering projects diverted water from the Colorado River through systems like the All-American Canal, transforming dry land into fertile farmland. Agriculture flourished, particularly date farming, and communities

such as Indio emerged as vital agricultural centers.

By the 1920s through the 1950s, the valley underwent another transformation - this time into a glamorous desert retreat. Palm Springs became a playground for Hollywood's elite, attracting stars like Frank Sinatra and Bob Hope.

Resorts, golf courses, and iconic mid-century modern architecture reshaped the region into a symbol of leisure and luxury.

In the decades following World War II, growth accelerated across the valley. Cities such as Palm Desert and La Quinta expanded rapidly, fueled by retirees, seasonal residents, and a growing tourism industry. Air conditioning and improved infrastructure made year-round living more practical, further driving population growth.

The late 20th and early 21st centuries introduced yet another chapter - one defined by cultural prominence and economic diversification. Global events like the Coachella Valley Music and Arts Festival and the Stagecoach Festival brought international attention, while healthcare, renewable energy, and logistics sectors began to complement tourism and agriculture.

Today, the Coachella Valley stands as a testament



to 250 years of change. From indigenous homelands to irrigated farmland, from Hollywood hideaway to globally recognized destination, the valley continues to evolve. Yet through all its transformations, it retains a defining characteristic that has endured across centuries: the ability to turn a challenging environment into a place of opportunity, community, and lasting appeal.

56 men signed the Declaration of Independence

Names like John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, and, of course, John Hancock might instantly come to mind when pondering the men who signed the Declaration of Independence in 1776. But what about the remaining signatories to the founding document of the United States?

According to the National Archives, 56 men signed the Declaration of Independence, and even historians and armchair history buffs might be hard pressed to name all 56 signers of the pivotal document. Some might even be surprised to learn that various notable figures from the era were not among the 56 signers on the Declaration of Independence, a list that includes Alexander Hamilton, John Jay and George Washington.

George Mason, another influential figure of the era, also decided against signing the Declaration of Independence, citing its lack of a “Bill of Rights” as motivation for keeping his pen to himself.

9. Optional Final Leg — Return to the Capital

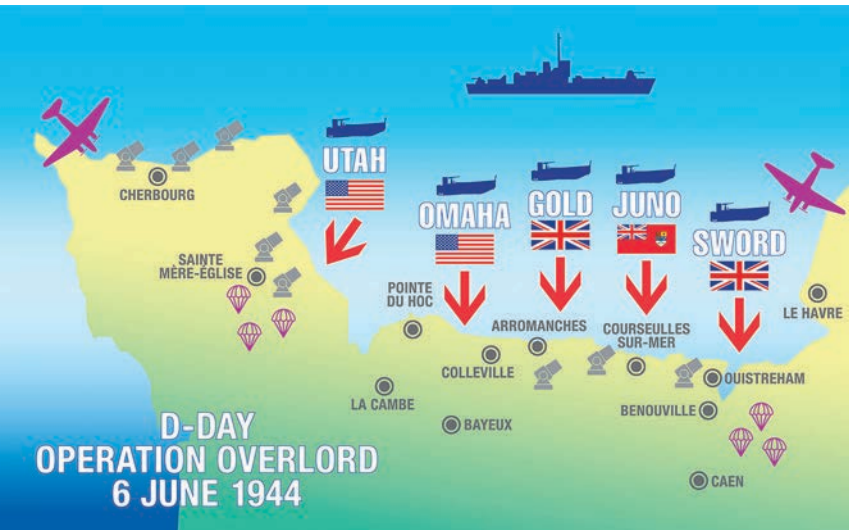

As residents of the United States of America celebrate the nation's two hundred and fiftieth anniversary, some might be curious where the "America" portion of the country's name comes from. According to the Library of Congress, America is named after Italian explorer Amerigo Vespucci. The LOC contends that Vespucci was the first to suggest that the lands Christopher Columbus sailed to in 1492 were part of a separate continent.

German mapmaker Martin Waldseemüller honored Vespucci's assertion in 1507, when he created a notable map that was the first to depict the lands as a separate continent, naming the area "America," which is a Latinized version of "Amerigo." That map is now part of the cartographic collections at the LOC, and is sometimes referred to as "America's Birth Certificate."

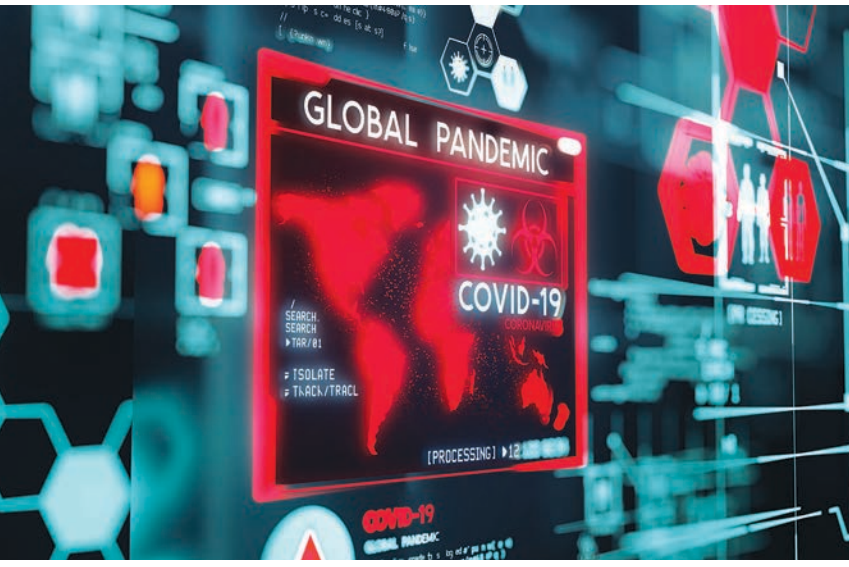

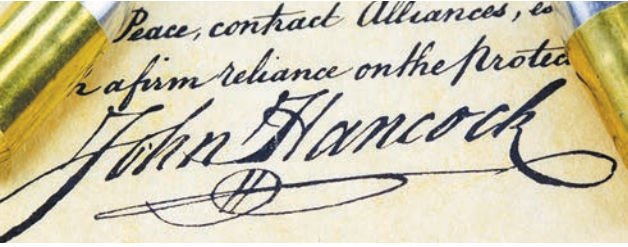

America's birthday

July 4, 1776, is an important date in American history that is widely considered the birthday of the United States of America. But some people argue that August 2 should actually be America's birthday, since that was when the Declaration of Independence was signed.

The National Archives says that the Second Continental Congress adopted the United States Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, formally severing ties with Britain. The approved Declaration was printed on July 5. On July 19, Congress ordered that the document be engrossed on parchment, which is a process of copying an official document in large hand. It is surmised that the engrosser was Timothy Matlock, an assistant to Charles Thomson, secretary to the Congress. It was nearly a month after the Declaration was adopted before the document began to be signed by delegates. The signing of the Declaration of Independence occurred primarily on August 2, 1776, at the Pennsylvania State House in Philadelphia, a building later renamed Independence Hall.

John Hancock, who was the President of the Congress, was the first to sign the engrossed copy. Signatures were arranged by states from northernmost to southernmost. Fifty-six delegates eventually signed the document, although not all were present to sign on August 2. Some delegates never managed to sign the Declaration, including Robert R. Livingston of New York, who was a member of the Declaration's drafting committee.

Thomas Paine

His name might not have been the inspiration for America's capital city, but Thomas Paine was a hugely influential figure in the formation of the United States. Born in England in 1737, Paine moved to Philadelphia in the early 1770s and soon wrote the pamphlet *Common Sense*.

According to the Mount Vernon Ladies' Association, Paine argued against the British colonial system, asserting it was rooted in tyranny directed by the aristocracy and monarchy. That assessment led Paine to contend the colonies should sever their ties to England and establish a democratic government.

The success of Paine's work is due to various factors, including his writing style, which was clear and simple and thus digestible to the masses, in a reader-friendly tone that many historians have noted helped to generate enthusiasm for the notion that the colonies should break apart from the British Empire.

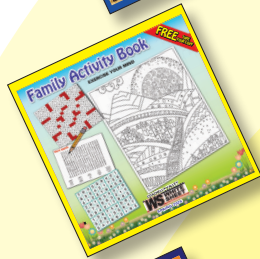
