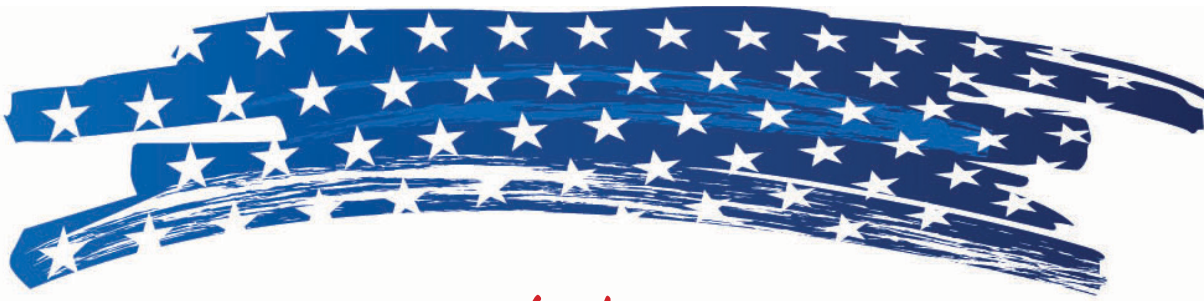

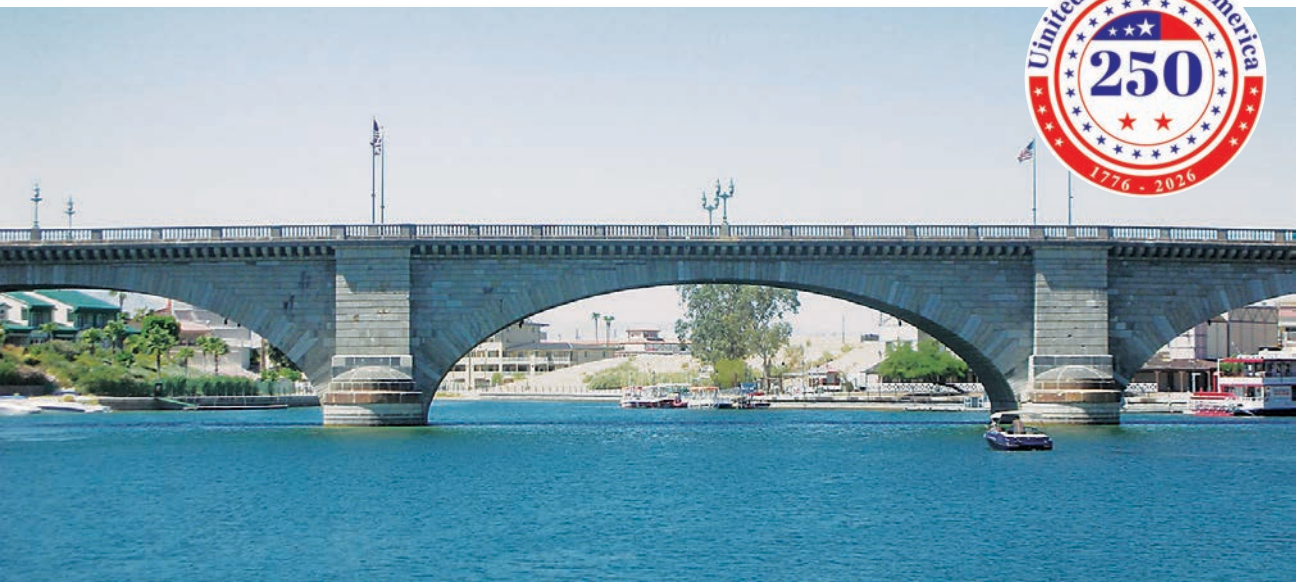

# CELEBRATE YOUR LOCAL HISTORY



## Lake Havasu City

### Origins Before the City

The area that would become Lake Havasu City was originally desert landscape along the Colorado River. It wasn't really a populated settlement, just open terrain. Lake Havasu itself didn't exist until the late 1930s, when Parker Dam was built on the Colorado River (1934-1938). The dam backed up the river to form a large reservoir – Lake Havasu – creating a shoreline in the desert. During World War II, a small Army Air Corps rest camp (Site Six) was located on the lake's shore, but there was no real town yet.

### Founding of Lake Havasu City (1960s)

In 1958, industrialist Robert P. McCulloch – founder of McCulloch Motors – saw potential in the lakeside land and began buying property around what was known as Pittsburgh Point on the lake's east shore. By 1963, McCulloch and partner C.V. Wood had acquired thousands of acres. On September 30,

1963, the Mohave County Board of Supervisors established the Lake Havasu Irrigation and Drainage District, formally creating the legal entity that became Lake Havasu City. The community was planned from the beginning and aggressively marketed to people across the U.S., especially those from colder climates. Free flights brought tens of thousands of prospective buyers to the area between 1964 and 1978.

### London Bridge: From Thames to Arizona

One of the most famous parts of the city's history is the relocation of London Bridge. In the late 1960s, McCulloch bought the deteriorating bridge from the City of London for about \$2.5 million and had it carefully disassembled stone by stone. It was shipped to Arizona and rebuilt across the Bridgewater Channel, a man-made waterway that now connects Lake Havasu with Thompson Bay. The reconstruction cost about \$7 million and was completed in 1971. Since its dedication on October 5, 1971, the bridge has been one of Arizona's most popular attractions – second only to the Grand Canyon in visitor draw.

### Growth and Incorporation

Between the 1960s and late 1970s, the city’s population grew steadily as land parcels were sold and new residents arrived. In 1978, Lake Havasu City was officially incorporated as a city separate from the irrigation district. By the early 1980s, the population had climbed to around 17,000, and continued to grow in the decades that followed.

### Modern Era

Today Lake Havasu City is known for recreation, tourism, and retirement living, with a thriving community built around the lake and its outdoor lifestyle. The city hosts numerous events (like regattas, fishing tournaments, and balloon festivals) and



draws visitors for its sunny weather, boating, and – of course – the London Bridge and adjoining English Village.



## State of Arizona

Arizona’s history spans thousands of years, beginning with Indigenous peoples such as the Ancestral Puebloans, Hohokam, Mogollon, Apache, and Navajo, who developed complex societies, irrigation systems, and trade networks long before European contact.

In the 16th century, Spanish explorers and missionaries arrived, and Arizona became part of New Spain. After Mexico gained independence from Spain in 1821, the region fell under Mexican control. Following the Mexican–American War, most of Arizona was ceded to the United States in 1848 through the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo,

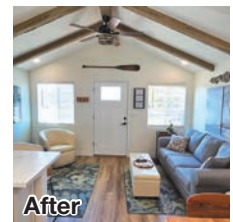
with the southern portion added by the Gadsden Purchase in 1853. Arizona became a separate U.S. territory in 1863 and was admitted to the Union as the 48th state on February 14, 1912.

Phoenix, Arizona’s capital, traces its roots to ancient Hohokam canals that inspired 19th-century settlers. Founded in 1867 by Jack Swilling as an agricultural community, the name “Phoenix” symbolized a city rising from the ruins of an ancient civilization. Phoenix became the territorial capital in 1889 and retained that role when Arizona achieved statehood. Today, it is the state’s largest city and a major cultural, economic, and political center of the Southwest.

## 56 men signed the Declaration of Independence

Names like John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, and, of course, John Hancock might instantly come to mind when pondering the men who signed the Declaration of Independence in 1776. But what about the remaining signatories to the founding document of the United States?

According to the National Archives, 56 men signed the Declaration of Independence, and even historians and armchair history buffs might be hard pressed to name all 56 signers of the pivotal document. Some might even be surprised to learn that various notable figures from the era were not among the 56 signers on the Declaration of Independence, a list that includes Alexander Hamilton, John Jay and George Washington.

George Mason, another influential figure of the era, also decided against signing the Declaration of Independence, citing its lack of a “Bill of Rights” as motivation for keeping his pen to himself.

# The Traveling Flag

### Route of the Traveling Flag

#### 8. The Pacific Arrival — The Horizon of the Future

**End Point:** California (San Diego > Los Angeles > San Francisco)

- Completion of continental unity
- Innovation and imagination
- America's outward-looking future

The flag meets the ocean—not as an ending, but as a launch point.

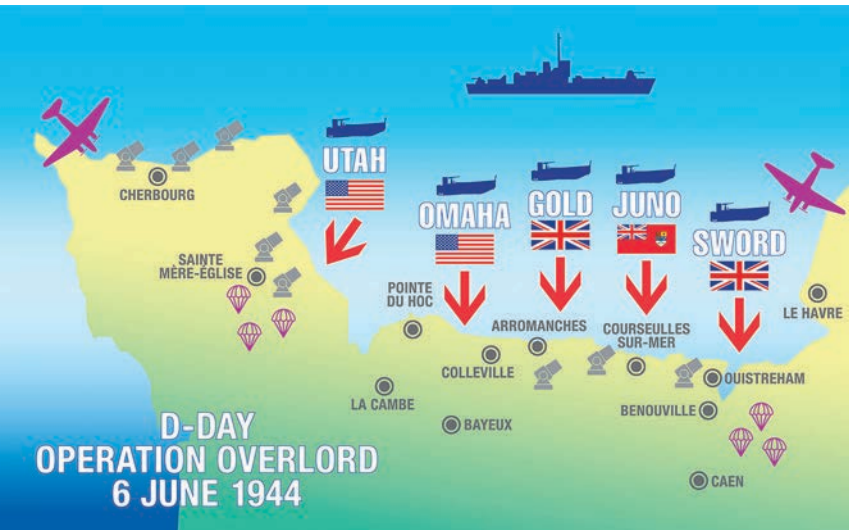

## How America got its name

As residents of the United States of America celebrate the nation's two hundred and fiftieth anniversary, some might be curious where the "America" portion of the country's name comes from. According to the Library of Congress, America is named after Italian explorer Amerigo Vespucci. The LOC contends that Vespucci was the first to suggest that the lands Christopher Columbus sailed to in 1492 were part of a separate continent.

German mapmaker Martin Waldseemüller honored Vespucci's assertion in 1507, when he created a notable map that was the first to depict the lands as a separate continent, naming the area "America," which is a Latinized version of "Amerigo." That map is now part of the cartographic collections at the LOC, and is sometimes referred to as "America's Birth Certificate."

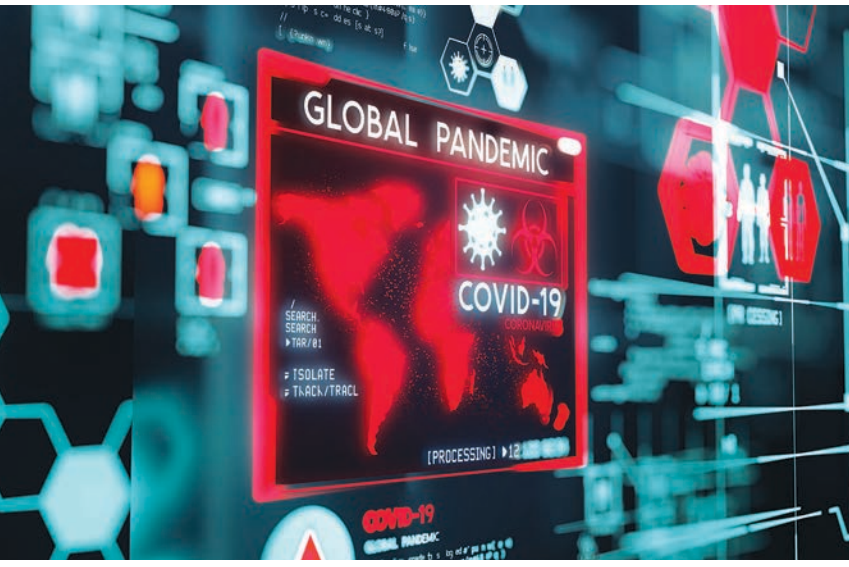

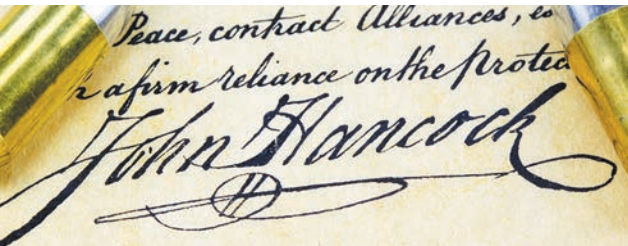

## America's birthday

July 4, 1776, is an important date in American history that is widely considered the birthday of the United States of America. But some people argue that August 2 should actually be America's birthday, since that was when the Declaration of Independence was signed.

The National Archives says that the Second Continental Congress adopted the United States Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, formally severing ties with Britain. The approved Declaration was printed on July 5. On July 19, Congress ordered that the document be engrossed on parchment, which is a process of copying an official document in large hand. It is surmised that the engrosser was Timothy Matlock, an assistant to Charles Thomson, secretary to the Congress. It was nearly a month after the Declaration was adopted before the document began to be signed by delegates. The signing of the Declaration of Independence occurred primarily on August 2, 1776, at the Pennsylvania State House in Philadelphia, a building later renamed Independence Hall.

John Hancock, who was the President of the Congress, was the first to sign the engrossed copy. Signatures were arranged by states from northernmost to southernmost. Fifty-six delegates eventually signed the document, although not all were present to sign on August 2. Some delegates never managed to sign the Declaration, including Robert R. Livingston of New York, who was a member of the Declaration's drafting committee.

# Thomas Paine

His name might not have been the inspiration for America's capital city, but Thomas Paine was a hugely influential figure in the formation of the United States. Born in England in 1737, Paine moved to Philadelphia in the early 1770s and soon wrote the pamphlet *Common Sense*.

According to the Mount Vernon Ladies' Association, Paine argued against the British colonial system, asserting it was rooted in tyranny directed by the aristocracy and monarchy. That assessment led Paine to contend the colonies should sever their ties to England and establish a democratic government.

The success of Paine's work is due to various factors, including his writing style, which was clear and simple and thus digestible to the masses, in a reader-friendly tone that many historians have noted helped to generate enthusiasm for the notion that the colonies should break apart from the British Empire.

Motorists traveling the Lincoln Highway experienced a cross-section of America, passing through bustling cities, agricultural regions, mountain ranges, and deserts. The route helped transform automobile travel from an adventure into a practical means of transportation.

### **The Santa Fe Trail: Commerce and Connection**

Between 1821 and 1880, the Santa Fe Trail linked Missouri and New Mexico, creating one of America's most important commercial routes. Stretching roughly 900 miles, it connected eastern manufacturers with southwestern markets.

Merchants transported textiles, tools, and consumer goods westward while returning with silver, livestock, and regional products. The trail also fostered cultural exchange among Native American tribes, Mexican communities, and American settlers.

Today, portions of the trail remain visible across the Great Plains and Southwest.

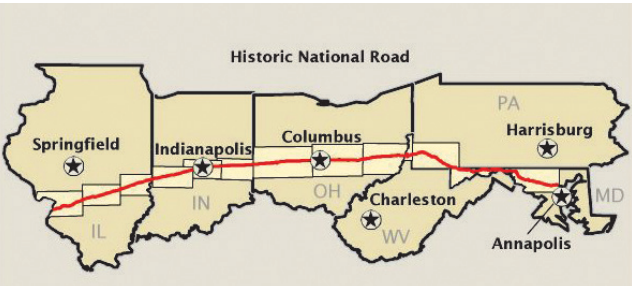
famous roadway stretched approximately 2,448 miles from Chicago to Santa Monica.

Route 66 became a symbol of freedom, adventure, and the pursuit of opportunity. During the Great Depression, thousands of families traveled west seeking a better life. Following World War II, the route became America's ultimate road trip destination.

**The National Road: America's First Federally Funded Highway**

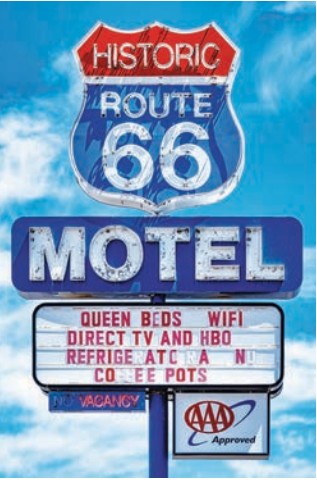

### Parker, Arizona

The history of Parker is deeply tied to the rugged landscapes and vital waterways of the American Southwest, where survival, transportation, and culture have long revolved around the Colorado River. Though today it is known as a quiet river town, Parker's roots reflect a dynamic past shaped by Native heritage, frontier expansion, and the growth of the American West.

Long before settlers arrived, the area was home to Indigenous peoples, particularly the Colorado River Indian Tribes, whose presence along the river dates back centuries. The river provided food, transportation, and a spiritual connection to the land. Today, Parker remains closely linked to the Colorado River Indian Tribes Reservation, which borders the town and continues to play a central role in the region's identity and culture.

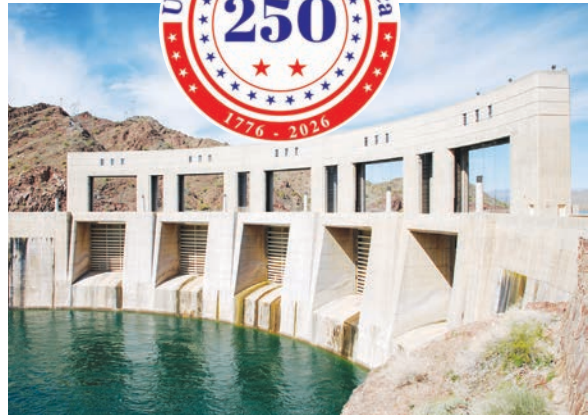
Parker's modern origins began in the early 20th century, when the expansion of transportation routes and river crossings made the location strategically important. The town was named after Ely Parker, a Civil War general and engineer, reflecting the era's tendency to honor notable nation-

al figures as new communities emerged in the West.

One of the most significant developments in Parker's history came with the construction of Parker Dam in the 1930s. Built during the Great Depression, the dam was a major engineering project that helped control the flow of the Colorado River and created Lake Havasu. This not only provided water and hydroelectric power to the region but also transformed Parker into a gateway for recreation and tourism.

The completion of the dam marked a turning point. What had been a modest crossing point began evolving into a destination for boating, fishing, and outdoor leisure. Over time, Parker developed a reputation as a river community where desert landscapes meet waterfront living—a contrast that continues to define it today.

Throughout the mid-20th century, Parker remained small but steady, supported by agriculture, government services tied to the



reservation, and seasonal tourism. Its role as the county seat of La Paz County further solidified its importance in the region when the county was established in 1983.

Today, Parker's history is still visible in its surroundings—from the enduring presence of the Colorado River to the influence of tribal lands and the infrastructure that made modern life in the desert possible. It is a town shaped not by rapid expansion, but by the steady flow of water, people, and time—an enduring reminder of how the American Southwest was built along the banks of its most essential river.

## La Paz County

The story of La Paz County is one of geography, resilience, and relatively recent political change, set against the timeless backdrop of the Colorado River. Though officially established in the late 20th century, the region's history stretches back centuries, shaped first by Native cultures and later by miners, settlers, and travelers moving through the rugged desert frontier.

Long before county lines were drawn, the area was inhabited by Indigenous peoples, including the Colorado River Indian Tribes, who relied on the river for sustenance and trade. The Colorado River served as both a lifeline and a corridor, connecting communities across what is now western Arizona and eastern California.

The name "La Paz," meaning "the peace" in Spanish, originates from a mid-19th century mining settlement along the river. During the 1860s, the discovery of gold sparked the growth of the town of La Paz, which quickly became a bustling hub for prospectors and commerce. For a time, it rivaled other frontier boomtowns in importance, serving as a supply and transportation center along the Colorado River.

However, like many mining communities, La Paz's prosperity was short-lived. As gold deposits dwindled, so did the population, and the town eventually faded into a ghost of its former self. Yet its name endured, later becoming the identity of the county itself.

For much of its modern history, the region that is now La Paz County was part of Yuma County. Over time, residents in the northern portion of Yuma County felt geographically and politically distant from county government, given the vast desert distances and limited infrastructure. This led to a push for local control and representation.

That effort culminated in 1982, when voters approved the creation of La Paz County, making it the newest county in Arizona. The county officially began operations in 1983, with Parker designated as the county seat. The formation marked a significant moment of self-determination for residents seeking governance closer to home.

Since its creation, La Paz County has remained largely rural and sparsely populated, defined by its wide-open desert spaces, river access, and seasonal influx of visitors. Communities like Quartzsite have become well known for their winter populations and events, while the Colorado River continues to anchor both recreation and local identity.

Today, La Paz County stands as a blend of old and new—where traces of gold rush history, Native heritage, and modern desert living coexist. It may be Arizona's youngest county, but its roots run deep, grounded in the enduring importance of the river and the independent spirit of those who call this remote corner of the state home.

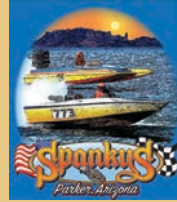

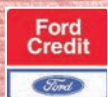
